#### **Change Over Days**

On Tuesday 4<sup>th</sup> July, the children will be spending the morning in their new classes.

Children that are moving to a new class have been participating in some transition activities with Mrs Webb. The Tuesday morning will allow the new classes to spend time together with their teachers so they can meet properly and do some activities in preperation for next September.

#### **New Wrens Visiting Afternoon**

We have invited our next year Wrens children and their families to spend an afternoon with us on Tuesday 4<sup>th</sup> July. We would also like to invite all parents of current Wrens and Robins children to come that afternoon from 1.30pm.

The afternoon will be a time for the new children to get to see their new classroom and meet some of the children who will be their friends next year.

It is also important for us to make the parents feel welcome, so would like them to have the opportunity to meet some existing parents.

The afternoon will be quite casual, with Mrs Taylor sharing some information about next year and OPTA providing some teas and coffees! Second hand uniform will be on sale that afternoon too.

## **End of Year Annual Reports**

Your child's end of year reports will be sent out on Monday 10<sup>th</sup> July. As well as written information from your child's class teacher about their learning in school this year, it will also include their teacher assessments to show how they are achieving in-line with their year group expectations.

If your child has taken any statutory assessments this year, the results of those will also be included. Due to the extra bank holiday in May, Y6 SATS were postponed slightly and so there will be a delay with schools receiving results. As these are not due into school until the 11<sup>th</sup>, Y6 reports will go out as normal and then the SAT results will follow the next day.

All reports will be sent to you electronically via ParentHub. The children will bring home a slip on the day, which we ask you to fill in and return to school acknowledging receipt of the report. Any comments you would like to make can also be made on the slip, or can me emailed through to us. If you would like to discuss your child's report in person, you can make an appointment with your child's teacher through the office.

#### **Building work**

We will be having some building work take place over the summer. Our open-plan classrooms, which were all the rage in the 1980's when the school was built, are not very popular with our children. They are not condusive with learning and the children, especially in Hawks complain that they are disturbed by people walking along the corridor and through their classroom (this is the only way for Kingfishers to access their toilets).

A new door opening is being opened up in the corridor outside the offices for Kingfisher children to access the toilet through. Hawks classroom is having a wall built between the classroom and the corridor.

A wall will also being built between the Wrens and Robins classrooms and the corridor outside the staffroom as well as a wall between the two classrooms.

Finally a door will be added so that Robins class will have direct access to the front outdoor play area. This will mean that they can access their classroom and leave in the afternoon directly from the classroom rather than through the cloakrooms.

We are very excited for the works to take place. It will be very different when we return in September. Hopefully all will go smoothly over the summer and we look forward to welcoming the children back to their new look school in September. We will let you have a look around then too!

#### Class Visits – Summer Term

Robins trip took them off to see the collection of old types of transport at The Shuttleworth Collection.
